Ponti graduated his studies in 1921 in Milan, in 1928 he founded the “Domus” review. He worked as both an Architect and a Designer, his portfolio ranged from dwelling houses and public buildings to everyday objects, as well as painting and set design. Most famously designing the Pirelli skyscraper in Italy in 1956. He started his collaboration with Venini in the Twenties, for which he designed lamps and objects.

The largest and most successful of the Murano glass furnaces, still in operation in Venice today. Established in 1925 by Paolo Venini, Venini embraced Modernism trends in art and architecture with their new designs in elegant shapes and colours. Venini was also known for enlisting various designers in their projects, bringing new ideas to Murano. These included; Napoleon Martinuzzi, Tommaso Buzzi, Carlo Scarpa, Gio Ponti, Tyra Lundgren and Fulvio Bianconi. Venini still produces a beautiful line of new and classic art vases and lighting every year.
