Artist description:

Driade was founded in 1968 by Enrico Astori and was for a long time one of the most glamorous and adventurous of the Italy's design-led brands, producing furniture, lighting and homewares. The company, based in Fossadello near Piacenza, produced iconic pieces including Starck's three-legged Costes cafe chair (1984) and Tokuji Yoshioka's monobloc Tokyo-Pop collection (2001).
